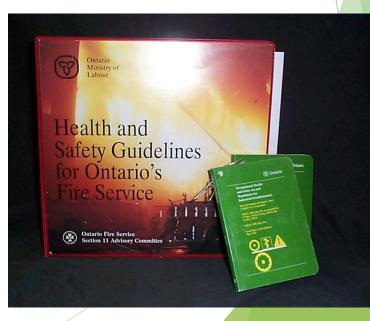

Primary Areas of Responsibility

- Programming of recreation, sports, aquatic, fitness, technology & skill development and leisure activities for all ages;
- Maintaining 130 acres of parkland, playground equipment, splash-pad, skateboard park, sports fields (soccer fields & baseball diamonds), tennis & basketball courts, recreational trails, municipal flower beds, hanging baskets, outdoor washroom facilities and the Parks Shop;
- Maintaining various indoor recreation facilities: Victoria Park Community Centre, Ingersoll District Memorial Arena, Fusion Youth Activity & Technology Centre and Ingersoll Seniors Activity Centre;
- Scheduling of sports fields (baseball diamonds & soccer fields) and indoor recreation facilities (arena, auditorium, meetings rooms, pool, squash courts);
- Community Development Acting as a staff resource and assisting community groups with special projects and special events i.e. Ingersoll Play-Right, Use of tables, chairs, picnic tables, stage etc. Planning community special events i.e. Festival of Lights, Santa's Festival Village, Town Wide\Thames River Clean Up;
